light, and neither did the oncoming vehicle they crashed into. Both brothers were thrown from the motorcycle and badly injured.

At the hospital, Godwin learned that he had fractured the femur and tibia in his left leg, and the femur in his right leg. He thought that at the very least his left leg would be amputated and he would face a lifetime of disability.

Ten days after surgery, Godwin returned home. Less than two months later, he returned to the hospital full of smiles, able to squat, and ready to resume full activity.

SIGN Mentors Lead the Way

Thanks to our donors and SIGN Surgeons, we have started a record 35 new programs so far in 2021! The process to start a new SIGN Program begins when a local surgeon applies to have their hospital become a SIGN Program. The program committee at SIGN Headquarters reviews the application to ensure the hospital is set up to accommodate orthopaedic surgery. They also communicate with other SIGN Surgeons in the country to confirm the surgeon has the potential to become a SIGN Surgeon.

Most surgeons that apply have had some experience with SIGN Surgery in their residency program. If they have not had any experience or need further training, we call upon in-country SIGN Surgeons to mentor them. They invite the new surgeon to their hospital to perform 10 SIGN cases and gain the appropriate level of experience. We have also arranged for surgeons to go to a nearby country to obtain the necessary training. Even with the pandemic and international travel restrictions this past 20 months, SIGN has continued to expand using this model. It has highlighted how SIGN Mentors are responsible for the expansion of SIGN Programs.

Some examples of SIGN Surgeons helping to start new programs by providing the training in SIGN Technique are Dr. Giuseppe Gaido in Kenya, who hosted a new SIGN Surgeon from Somalia, Dr. Biruk Wamisho in Ethiopia and Dr. Billy Haonga from Tanzania, who both travel to the potential new programs in their country to provide

personalized training, and Dr. John Ekure, who recently provided training to help start a new program in Uganda.

These mentor surgeons, and others like them, are experts in SIGN Technique. They perform hundreds of SIGN Surgeries each year in austere operating room environments and have developed the skills to overcome barriers, such as power outages and lack of resources. They are talented surgeons, despite the adversity, which makes them the best possible teachers. The other benefit of receiving training from a SIGN Surgeon is that the new surgeon will have an in-country surgeon to call upon for counsel and mentorship.

The SIGN Surgical Database is one of the main online mentorship tools that we use. Dr. Zirkle has been providing mentorship and feedback on the cases reported into the surgical database since it went live in October 2003. Recently Dr. Zirkle decided to start a pilot project whereby SIGN Surgeon Mentors would learn to review the database and provide online mentorship, as well. The idea behind this is not only to pass on his knowledge, but also to expose the new mentors to the vast talent and creativity of their worldwide colleagues.

> We will continue to partner with North American and European surgeons to assist us in expanding surgical skills beyond long bone care. These surgeons travel to provide training and mentorship for other specialties such as limb deformity, pelvic fractures and will include spine care in the future.
